Opening Our Hearts to God

Jesus addressed our tendency to minimize life with God for the pleasures of money. Jesus said of those who hesitate to follow him, "what does if profit them if they gain the whole world, but lose or forfeit themselves." (Luke 9:25)

Why do we do this when it comes to money? Why do we work so hard to get it and then work even harder to keep it?

Perhaps, it has something to do with ownership. If there is one quality we value above others it is self-reliance. We like to have ownership, so we feel we are controlling the details of our life. We like the feeling that money then gives us.
