Being the Church

Over the years, we seem to have altered the meaning of the word *church*. In our common usage, sometimes it means a *place* that we go to. Other times, it refers to an activity, such as, when does *church* start? Often the word is used to describe an *institution* – the Evangelical Lutheran *Church* in America. Such definitions are appropriate, but they miss the original meaning and purpose of *church*.

The essence of *church* is family – people around the world who follow Christ, living lives of compassion, grace, and love. When the Apostle Paul wrote about the *church*, he wasn't writing about a building, an activity, or an institution. For Paul, the expression *church* meant a personal relationship with one another. He most often compared the *church* to the human body.

In the body, all parts are important and must function in harmony. If one part of the body is injured or sick, then the entire body suffers. All parts of the body must operate in unison to function. Some parts are more visible, while others play a vital role within. There are no small parts in the body of Christ.

So, don't think of *going to church*, which focuses on buildings and events.

Instead, think of the people who are the *church*. Appreciate them for who they are, what they need, and what they contribute to the body. Think about yourself.

What is your role? How do you contribute to the overall health and fitness of the body?

Being the church involves an interactive relationship between people, with Christ as the common bond. With such an understanding, we don't ever leave church, but are the church each and every day.
