## What a Friend We Have in Jesus

In reading the Gospels, we discover that the personality of Jesus was such that people who were pagans, cultists, money-changers, broken, and diseased felt comfortable in his presence. Jesus was always surrounded by the poor, by the marginalized; and, he was often opposed by the powerful. It is comforting for us to know that Jesus liked people. He accumulated friends and

they wrote about him, talked about him, and testified about him. Jesus ate with people, attended parties with people, prayed with people, and traveled with people. He did so because he actually liked people and cared about them. Jesus built a faith community entirely on relationships.

During his life, one of the criticisms of Jesus was that he was a friend of pagans. Not that he spent time with them, but that he was their friend. Jesus viewed people with a great deal of empathy, especially those people who existed on the fringes of society.

There were people Jesus did not take a liking to, but such people were arrogant, questioned his authority, and burdened people with excessive religious baggage. Jesus wanted people to be together, to live together, to love one another. Jesus prayed that those who heard the gospel would be one. When asked which was the greatest commandment, Jesus replied, to love our Father, and added, to love our neighbor. Jesus teaches us the most important aspect of life is to have a relational commitment with God and with one another.

It must have been wonderful to spend time with Jesus, with somebody who liked you, loved you, and believed in you. It must have been comforting to feel significant in his presence. It must have been thrilling to look into the eyes of God and have him look back and communicate that each person, every individual, holds immense

value and beauty, and is worthy of a dear relationship with God. We can take great comfort that Jesus would like us were we to meet face-to-face.
