Season of Advent

With Advent the new church year begins. The first Sunday of Advent -- this year is November 29th -- is the Sunday closest to St. Andrew's Day (Nov 30th). The season of Advent varies in length from 22 to 28 days, ending Christmas Eve. The season is looked upon as a time of personal reflection and introspection, preparation through penitence, prayer and patience.

The word *advent* originated from the two Latin words: *ad* (to or toward) and *venire* (to come), thus "to come toward." The word emphasizes the joyful anticipation of Christ coming to our world. We celebrate three aspects of the "coming" of Jesus:

- 1. the coming of Jesus in human form
- 2. the coming of Jesus in Word and Spirit
- 3. the second coming of Jesus in glory.

Advent directs the church to examine the events surrounding Jesus' birth, to reflect on the revelation of Christ in scripture, and to look ahead to Christ's final return. We prepare and hope for the entrance of Christ into this world and the next.

The color for Advent is purple, which symbolizes dignity and royalty, but also the sorrow and penitence of Christ. The color blue, symbolizing hope, may also be used during Advent.

The Advent wreath symbolizes watchfulness and anticipation as the Lord's nativity approaches. The wreath has four outer candles. The *Prophecy* candle announces the period of waiting; the *Bethlehem* candle symbolizes the preparations being made to receive the Christ child; the *Shepherds'* candle typifies the act of sharing Christ; the *Angels'* candle symbolizes love and Christ's final coming. A fifth candle, the *Christ* candle, sits in the center of the wreath to remind us that Christ is the light of the world. Lighting an additional candle each week during Advent symbolizes the increasing amount of light spread to the world as Jesus' coming approaches. The circular evergreen wreath represents eternal life through Christ, God's gift to us.
