

Lent has just started, well actually February 22<sup>nd</sup> and we are headed to our first Lenten Wednesdays of Prayers Around the Cross. The time of Lent is a time to be reminded of our mortality and the life that God offers us in God's Love for us in Jesus. Without that Life-Giving Love, we would have nothing.

that can help you through the time of Lent. I read this book or listen to it, just about every year. I invite you to read the “A Word Before” from the author.

...This book is not for the superspiritual. It is not for muscular Christians who have made John Wayne, and not Jesus, their hero. It is not for academics who would imprison Jesus in the ivory tower of exegesis. It is not for noisy, feel-good folks who manipulate Christianity into a naked appeal to emotion. It is not for hooded mystics who want magic in their religion. It is not for Alleluia Christians who live only on the mountaintop and have never visited the valley of desolation. It is not for the fearless and tearless. It is not for red-hot zealots who boast with the rich young ruler of the Gospels, “All these commandments I have kept from my youth.” It is not for the complacent who hoist over their shoulders a tote bag of honors, diplomas, and good works, actually believing they have it made.

It is not for legalists who would rather surrender control of their souls to rules than run the risk of living in union with Jesus. If anyone is still reading along, The Ragamuffin Gospel was written for the bedraggled, beat-up, and burnt-out. It is for the sorely burdened who are still shifting the heavy suitcase from one hand to the other. It is for the wobbly and weak-kneed who know they don't have it all together and are too proud to accept the handout of amazing grace. It is for inconsistent, unsteady disciples whose cheese is falling off their



cracker. It is for poor, weak, sinful men and women with hereditary faults and limited talents. It is for earthen vessels who shuffle along on feet of clay. It is for the bent and the bruised who feel that their lives are a grave disappointment to God. It is for smart people who know they are stupid and honest disciples who admit they are scalliwags. The Ragamuffin Gospel is a book I wrote for myself and anyone who has grown weary and discouraged along the Way.

Brennan was ordained a Franciscan priest but later left the priesthood. He, like so many of us, needed to learn to reconcile to himself to receive the reconciliation of God, so he too could be reconciled to others.

## **Casa Grande Site Move**

Hopefully you had a chance to participate in the Casa Grande dialogs. As you would have heard, we are really left with only one viable option with

our presences in Casa Grande.

On March 19th, we will hold our final worship service at our present location in Casa Grande. The 10 a.m. service will move to Arizona City for the time being.

All of the items from the current site will be packed up and stored either in Arizona City or at Rick Hagen's store room for his grocery store in Eloy. A big thank you for doing this, otherwise there might be some costs associated with the storage.

Car pooling will be arranged to assist with making sure everyone that attended in Casa Grande, has the opportunity to attend in Arizona City. Look for more information on this.

We need your help. Please bring moving boxes to Casa Grande or Arizona City ASAP. Following the March 19th service, we will need to stack chairs for later transport. During that week, we will need help packing boxes to be transported on Saturday March 25th. Those details are still being worked out, but we hope to be able to pay some college folks to help us move.

After we move and begin both services in Arizona City, we will begin planning on how we can move back to Casa Grande. This will also be done, hopefully with the help of another congregation that will anchor with us as, an Anchor Church.

Currently the council and pastor are in conversations with the Synod and another congregation to enter into a covenant for assistance. We are looking at an accompany process with Central Lutheran.

All of this is still in the planning process and there

is still many pieces that have to be worked out. There are no fees to Central Lutheran. As we get more details, they will be released.

We will look for guidance from the Anchor church, its leaders and pastor. Through conversations we will look to see what might be next for Central Lutheran.

When there are enough details to do a presentation, one will be done for the entire congregation. We will only get what we put in. We all need to be part of the process. The success of Central Lutheran's future depends upon everyone pitching in.

## Responding to God

God has and does everything for us. God has provided and will provide and do everything to make sure that we are in heaven, when it is our time.

Mt. 6:17, "But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face,"

Mt. 6:3, "But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing,"

Even in the Old Testament, we are given examples for how to respond and know that God sees this.

Heb.6:10 "God is not unjust; he will not forget your work and the love you have shown him as

you have helped his people and continue to help them."

Heb. 13:16, "And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased."

Prov. 3:27, "Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to act."


